¹ But on the first day of the week, at early dawn, they came to the tomb bringing the spices which they had prepared. ² And they found the stone rolled away from the tomb, ³ but when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. ⁴ While they were perplexed about this, behold, two men suddenly stood near them in dazzling clothing; ⁵ and as *the women* were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, *the men* said to them, “Why do you seek the living One among the dead? ⁶ “He is not here, but He has risen. Remember how He spoke to you while He was still in Galilee, ⁷ saying that the Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men, and be crucified, and the third day rise again.” ⁸ And they remembered His words,

It is Certain that Jesus Died

- Scriptural evidence is overwhelming.
- The truth is often harder to believe than a lie.

It is Certain that Jesus Rose from the Dead

- Reasons Jesus' friends couldn't have taken the body.
- Reasons Jesus' enemies couldn't have taken the body.
- There is only one reasonable explanation as to what happened to the body of Jesus.

Looking unto Jesus, The Author and Finisher of our Faith. Heb. 12: 2

- Jesus was no longer dead, but living , still people look for peace with God from among the dead?
- How do we look for peace with God from among the dead?

Conclusion

- Hebrews 9: 27 – 28, “And inasmuch as it is appointed for men to die once and after this *comes* judgment, so Christ also, having been offered once to bear the sins of many, will appear a second time for salvation without *reference to sin*, to those who eagerly await Him.
