¹⁵ 'You shall also count for yourselves from the day after the sabbath, from the day when you brought in the sheaf of the wave offering; there shall be seven complete sabbaths. 16 'You shall count fifty days to the day after the seventh sabbath; then you shall present a new grain offering to the LORD. 17 'You shall bring in from your dwelling places two loaves of bread for a wave offering, made of two-tenths of an ephah; they shall be of a fine flour, baked with leaven as first fruits to the LORD. 18 'Along with the bread you shall present seven one year old male lambs without defect, and a bull of the herd and two rams; they are to be a burnt offering to the LORD, with their grain offering and their drink offerings, an offering by fire of a soothing aroma to the LORD.

19 'You shall also offer one male goat for a sin offering and two male lambs one year old for a sacrifice of peace offerings. ²⁰ 'The priest shall then wave them with the bread of the first fruits for a wave offering with two lambs before the LORD; they are to be holy to the LORD for the priest. 21 'On this same day you shall make a proclamation as well; you are to have a holv convocation. You shall do no laborious work. It is to be a perpetual statute in all your dwelling places throughout your generations.

Set Time for Thanksgiving

- God set the date for Israel 50 days after First Fruit offerings.
 - Around May-June each year.
- Plymouth separatists set a date in 1621.
 - Sometime between September 18-December 11.
 - Puritans set apart another day of Thanksgiving in 1623.
- Abraham Lincoln set the national holiday of Thanksgiving October 3, 1863 for last Thursday of November each year.
 - December 1941, Congress established the 3rd
 Thursday of November each year.

Community Thanksgiving

- Verse 21 calls for a holy convocation.
 - In other words a holy assembly.
- Thanksgiving is a get together time.
 - It's a great time to be a blessing to the less fortunate.
 - Due to time off it's a great time to focus on our relationship with God through Christ.
